Writing the Introduction





Some background information on the topic.

Yes, but provide **only the essentials** the marker needs to appreciate your critical analysis later!





A provocative rhetorical question to interest the reader.

No, rhetorical questions are not used in academic writing. **Use a statement** instead.





A recap of the research you have undertaken on the topic.

No, this belongs in the **conclusion**.






An indication of your line of argument to follow.

Yes, this will help the marker **anticipate** the **structure** of your **main body**.





This report will first examine how AI and big data are utilised to automate time-consuming tasks like market research and customer support, increasing Organisation x's efficiency and productivity (Author z, 2022), before proceeding to explore the risks posed by using imperfect data and how to overcome these.



Writing Your Introduction

Checklist:



Background information all **relevant** and **revisited** critically in main body



Main keywords in assignment question engaged with



Structure of main body clearly signposted



Suitable length (around 10% of the total word count usually expected for introduction and conclusion combined)

Writing the Conclusion



A recap of the main points of your argument.

Yes, but keep this **concise**. Only the **central themes** should be restated.





Some new information on the topic not mentioned before.

No, all **information relevant** to your **argument** should be **covered in the main body**.





A quotation that appears to sum up your findings.

No, if an existing quotation can sum up your findings, then your research is **not particularly valuable**.






An indication of how your findings are significant for future research, or your career or organisation's development.

Yes, demonstrate how your research will have positive **consequences** for **yourself**, your **company** and/or **the field**.









Structure of a Conclusion: Specific to General Summary of Findings Provide a broad 1C. Summary overview. Link to Assignment Question 2A. Link **Reiterate assignment** topic. **Implications/Next Steps** Demonstrate the **3B. Implications** importance of your completed project.





Example Conclusion



The example on the next slide fulfils the structural requirements of a conclusion:

- 1. Summarises main findings
- 2. Restates the assignment topic
- 3. Demonstrates possible consequences of the research

However, it has some issues with content.

Identify the content issues and suggest potential improvements.

Poor Conclusion

Summarises main points

Restates the assignment topic

Demonstrates consequences of research







Overstated Claims

The opportunities and challenges posed by the digital revolution on the industry have thus been examined and concerns have been shown to be entirely exaggerated. Assignment topic not covered fully

Writing Your Conclusion

Checklist:



Main points of argument summarised and linked back to assignment



Conclusions well-supported by academic evidence



Implications of research explored



Suitable length (around 10% of the total word count usually expected for introduction and conclusion combined)



Introductions and Conclusions - Review



The content of an introduction should develop from the specific to general.



Introductions and Conclusions - Review



A conclusion should demonstrate the importance of your completed project and possible consequences for future research / development.



Introductions and Conclusions - Review



Around 10% of an assignment's word count is usually expected for the introduction and conclusion combined.
