### **Paraphrases**

You should paraphrase when you are **interested solely in an idea**, and not the language used to express this idea.

As information on social media is generated by users, such information can be subjective or inaccurate, and frequently includes misinformation and conspiracy theories (Bridgman et al., 2020).

Hard-won gains from policies to increase the number of women in the paid workforce and to increase women's pay to equal that of men may be quickly eroded if women are disadvantaged by the process of automation (Brussevich et al., 2018).

### **Direct Quotations**

Use direct quotations when you are interested in both the idea and **the language used to express the idea**, e.g. striking phrases and influential definitions that you may engage with in more detail.

Leadership is "getting people to go where they wouldn't have gone on their own" (Cheshire, 2010).

(Visser, 2011, p. 127)

In medicine, the dominance of a culture that values projecting confidence, certainty, and hiding vulnerability has created an "epidemic of silence" (Bould et al., 2015, p. 30).

(Pack et al., 2022, pp. 1-2)





When paraphrasing you should aim to retain the original idea but express it in a different way.





A paraphrase should include an in-text citation.





A paraphrase picks out the main points of a much longer original text.

No, this is a summary!





You should put quotation marks around the paraphrase to show that the paraphrase is not your original idea.

No, this is a direct quotation!







You can include some key expressions directly taken from the original in quotation marks within a paraphrase.





# 2. Paraphrasing by Changing Voice





### 2. Active Voice

When using the active voice, the subject of the sentence performs an action:

Subject Verb Object

Liu et al. (2017) showed that scalability is an essential measure of the success of the cybersecurity Internet of Things framework.

(Tawalbeh et al., 2020)

The active voice emphasises the subject of the sentence. You may therefore use the active voice if you are interested in the individuals involved (e.g., if Liu et al. are an influential group of thinkers or if you are challenging their ideas).



### 2. Passive Voice

When using the passive voice, the object of the sentence has an action performed on it:

Object Verb

Scalability has been shown as an essential measure.

Scalability has been shown as an essential measure of the success of the cybersecurity Internet of Things framework (Liu, et al., 2017).

The passive voice emphasises the object of the sentence. It is predominantly used in academic writing as we are primarily interested in ideas, processes and events, instead of the individuals involved.

#### **Active Voice**

Liu et al. (2017) showed that scalability is an essential measure of the success of the cybersecurity Internet of Things framework.




# 3. Paraphrasing by Changing Word Class

There are claims by critics of these renewable energy schemes that the benefits are less than they seem. Firstly, spending money on other projects such as roadbuilding would also allow the creation of jobs.



Critics of these schemes claim that the results are not as beneficial as they seem. Firstly, if the money was spent on other projects such as road building jobs would also be created.


# 4. Paraphrasing by Changing Sentence Structure

Higher government borrowing to pay for green investments must be financed by the taxpayer, and it may eventually affect the cost of borrowing for all businesses.



The taxpayer must finance higher government borrowing to pay for the investment, and all business borrowing may eventually be affected.

# Combining Paraphrasing Strategies

In your group, try to combine the strategies of changing vocabulary, voice, word class and sentence structure to paraphrase this paragraph.

Smith (2022) claims the Spanish government has overspent in subsidising renewable energy for the next two decades. While the estimated expenditure of 29 billion euros will provide 50,000 new roles, Jones (2023) argues that if the government had allowed private industry to spend the same amount, 113,000 posts would have been created instead. These analysts therefore believe that the Spanish scheme will actually destroy over 50,000 jobs in the decades ahead.




# **Combining Paraphrasing Strategies**



In your group, try to combine the strategies of changing vocabulary, voice, word class and sentence structure to paraphrase this paragraph.

The potential subsidies given by Spain to renewable energy producers for the 2030s and 40s have been challenged (Smith, 2022). The 50,000 jobs created will each cost €570,000, and it can be argued that had the state permitted private businesses to spend the same sum over twice as many jobs would have been provided (Jones, 2023). According to such calculations the subsidies in Spain have effectively eliminated more than 50,000 posts.

As an academic writer, you are expected to be critical of the sources that you use. This essentially means questioning what you read and not necessarily agreeing with it just because the information has been published. Being critical can also mean looking for reasons why we should not just accept something as being correct or true. This can require you to identify problems with a writer's arguments or methods, or perhaps to refer to other people's criticisms of these. Constructive criticism goes beyond this by suggesting ways in which a piece of research or writing could be improved.



A successful assignment is likely to contain more paraphrases than direct quotations.





You should paraphrase when you are interested in both an idea and the language used to express that idea.





A paraphrase should retain the meaning of the original material.





It is sufficient to change sentence structure for a successful paraphrase.
