Learn On Demand Setup Guide

Minimum Technical Requirements to run a course in Learn On Demand

Please be advised that wired Internet Access is preferred but we do appreciate that may not be possible if attending your course from home. You will need to carry out the connection test as detailed in this document and may need to configure your home network to allow internet access according to your own security policies/restrictions/IP ranges. Due to the many different options and possible configurations, QA cannot provide you with details on how to do this.

The minimum acceptable bandwidth for this course is 10mb. Please ensure that you are not sharing a network with family members who may be streaming video/music/games at the same time as this could lead to poor connectivity and drop outs.

The labs are best accessed via the latest CHROME browser.

Given the slightly reduced available screen size of the remote lab machines, a screen size of 16 inch or above is required and 19 inch or better would be preferred. Resolution should be capable of at least 1280x1024.




Testing the connection

To connect to the test lab, copy and paste this link into a modern HTML5 browser (such as Chrome) <u>https://labondemand.com/Launch/122B02AA</u>.

Click on the Resources link button in the top right-hand corner of the screen as shown below.




Now select the CTRL+ALT+DELETE button.



Now select the T next to the Password T Pa\$\$word box as shown below. This will auto populate the password box in the main screen for you.

You will then be presented with your virtual Windows desktop.


This has proved that you can connect to the Learn On Demand environment.

In the top right hand of the screen, if you click the Instructions link, you will be presented with some sample Objectives and scenarios. These are provided to give you a look and feel of how the interface works.



We strongly suggest you follow the menu guides to familiarise yourself with the way Learn on Demand works.

If you click on the 4 bar icon at the top of the screen as shown below you will be able to see information regarding your connection. You ideally need a Latency of under 200ms for best performance.



Once your connection has been verified, you can close the session by clicking the 3 horizontal lines in the top right corner of the screen and then select end.



Then select "Yes, end my lab" and when the "Lab Closed" is shown you can close the browser windows.


